# News from the Kindergarten Classrooms

## Kindergarten Daydream and Kindergarten Hamilton

### English

During Literacy lessons, students are learning about recount texts and imaginative texts, and continue to focus on writing interesting sentences using adjectives. When writing, students are encouraged to say their sentences out loud before writing them to make sure they sound right. This term, students are writing factual recounts about their weekends, and are also learning about imaginative text and recounts as they explore text such as Family Forest, Tom Tom and Whoever You Are. Students practised saying oral recounts out loud while peers recorded them, this enabled them to critique their own sentences before writing them. Students are developing their confidence in trying to spell new words independently by stretching and recording the sounds which is supported by the daily Sound Waves activities. During Chatterbox, students are developing their public speaking skills as they are encouraged to present short impromptu speeches, which will assist them in the upcoming Public Speaking Competition.

### Numeracy

During Mathematics lessons, Kindergarten are learning about Addition and Subtraction, and Area. Students have been learning the language of addition and subtraction in order to recognise a mathematical problem and solve it correctly, such as counting backwards, counting forward, altogether, plus, minus, take away, difference. Each concept we learn during Whole Number lessons is reinforced during Targeting Early Numeracy (TEN) lessons. This week, students worked in their ability based TEN groups, using concrete materials and visualisation to solve and record problems. In the next few weeks, we will be learning about Patterns and Algebra, and Volume and Capacity.

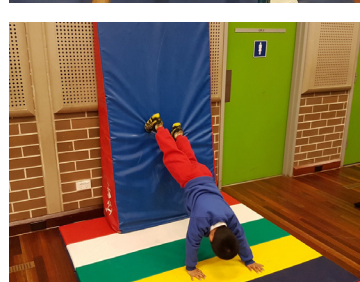
### Science & History

Our Science topic this term is 'Waterproof Wonders' and is linked to Made Environments. Students have opportunity to practise the science skills of observing, questioning, predicting and communicating during whole class and small group activities. We are exploring the materials that assist our everyday lives and the reasons they were created. They will develop their understanding of how products, places and spaces are made to suit their purpose by exploring the properties of materials such as metal, plastic and paper, and why some materials are waterproof. During History lessons, we are learning about our Ancestry as part of the Personal and Family Histories Unit. Students will learn how their backgrounds, past

experiences and memories are important. This was a good introduction in the lead up to Cultural Diversity Day.

Students are enjoying learning Gymnastics and Fundamental Movement Skills as part of fitness lessons and the Sports in Schools program. Students have been practising and exploring exercises such as walking along a balance beam, crab walks, bar work, front tumbles and rolls and ring work.

Students also enjoyed being an interactive audience for the Musica Viva incursion and learnt about the history behind traditional Japanese music and instruments.

The students in Daintree have been very helpful.

K/1/2 Cairns are learning to use the iPads to help with our writing. On the iPads, we have tried to record what we want to write, then with a partner type a sentence. In Mathematics we have been learning how to improve our addition and subtraction, and measuring the length and area of different objects.

## 1 Byron

1 Byron have been learning about historical narratives during literacy. We learnt about Elizabeth, the youngest convict to be sent to Australia on the First Fleet. Elizabeth was only 7 years old which is the same age as some of us in 1 Byron! We couldn't believe that someone so young could go on such a long journey on their own. We have been listening to stories and retelling them in order. We know that all narratives must have a beginning, middle and end in order to make sense.

We also really enjoyed the Musica Viva TAIKOZ performance on Monday during Education Week. Students were able to listen to the traditional drumming techniques whilst learning about a different culture and having fun at the same time! Olivia was even lucky enough to go up on stage and participate in a traditional Japanese drumming song. Students were

## 1/2 Kakadu

1/2 Kakadu are extending their computer skills this term. They are going to the computer lab each Monday and accessing their spelling words via Google Classroom. Google Classroom is an electronic project 'sharing' platform which allows Ms Bradley to send out the spelling lists for students. They can then access them, edit the document and type their words into the template, and send them back to Ms Bradley, all via Google Classroom. With only a few short weeks of practise most students are now able to log onto the computers and their departmental student email accounts, follow a link sent by Ms Bradley, and open up their spelling list words ready to edit! Some students have even explored 'turning in' their finished word lists which sends them back to Ms Bradley via her Google Drive to mark! Ms Bradley is very surprised and excited with how quickly students have adapted and learnt these new skills!

## 2 Uluru

This term 2Uluru have been learning about length in Maths. They have been learning how to estimate and measure using metres and centimetres, how to compare and order objects according to their length and how to measure distances using metre rulers and a trundle wheel. They had lots of fun using the trundle wheel to measure as it was much easier than using the metre ruler to measure longer distances.



2Uluru also participated in a Cultural Diversity Day Degustation and Sport-a-thon to help celebrate Education Week. They got to eat lots and lots of yummy food from all around the world on Wednesday, then on Thursday got the chance to work it all off by playing sport ALL DAY!! Along with 2Kakadu, they got to shoot some hoops, participate in relay races, play tennis and use the parachute. Running under the parachute and trying to get out the other side before it came back down caused lots of laughter and craziness! They had lots of fun celebrating Education Week with the theme, I Learn, We Learn.



## 2 Fraser

2 Fraser has been learning about different materials in science. We have had fun manipulating and combining different types of objects whilst hypothesising what type of outcome we will get. We have had lots of fun in art using the same technique of manipulating to create pieces of work that are different and imaginative.

In maths, students have been exploring length by estimating and comparing distances. We have also developed skills counting and ordering Australian money. Students are becoming great problem solvers especially when they can see how they can use these skills in the world around them.

## 4/5 Kimberley

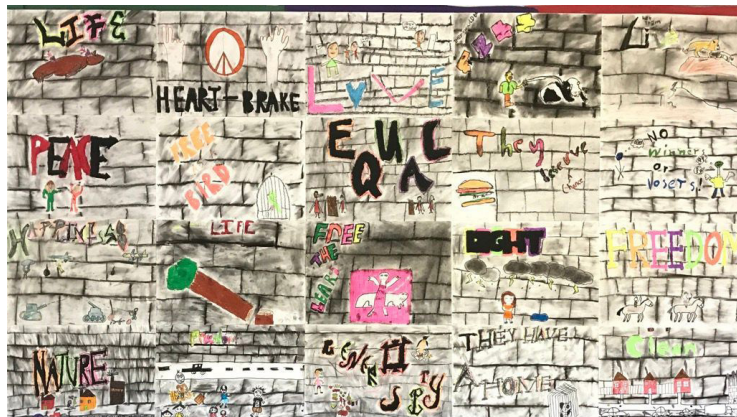

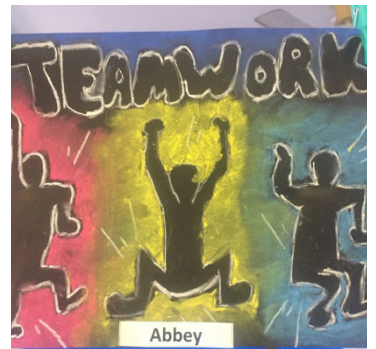
We are looking forward to lots more fun learning in Term 3.

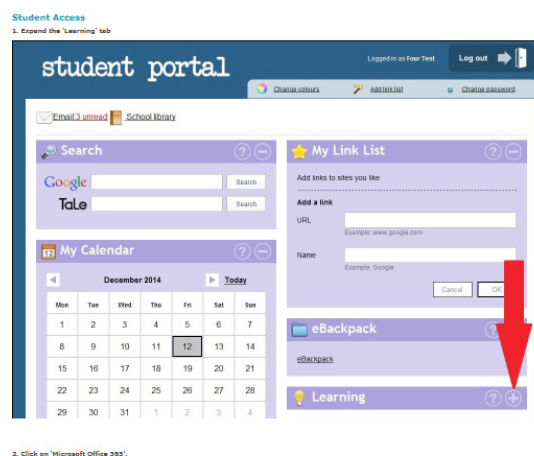

## "BRIANNA AND DEBBIE'S DOUBLE CHOP FOR CHARITY"



My name is Brianna Da Silva and I am a Year 4 student. My brother, Luke, is in the Year 2 support class and we both attend Padstow North Public School.

Late in 2014, my family set up a fundraiser called "Brianna's Chop for Charity" and we raised \$1,846 for the Cancer Council of NSW. I donated my long hair, which was cut off at the school assembly, to the Variety's Princess Charlotte Alopecia Program and it was made into a wig for kids without hair.

At a very young age, my brother and I have seen the effects that a Cancer diagnosis can have on a family when our mum, Debbie, was diagnosed with a very aggressive and unusual (Stage 3) Breast Cancer. At the time, mum donated her hair to the same program before it fell out from chemotherapy.



Mum and I have decided to do a final charity drive at Padstow North. We have both grown our hair long and will have it chopped short at assembly on Thursday 31st August to make into more wigs for needy kids. **Please sponsor us by raising funds for our Cancer Council NSW fundraiser with a tax deductible donation to <http://nsw.cancercouncilfundraising.org.au/BriannaDeb>**

Luke and I saw first hand at the age of 13 months and 3 how Cancer affects families. Please help us to help others and make this world free of Cancer. Thank you.
