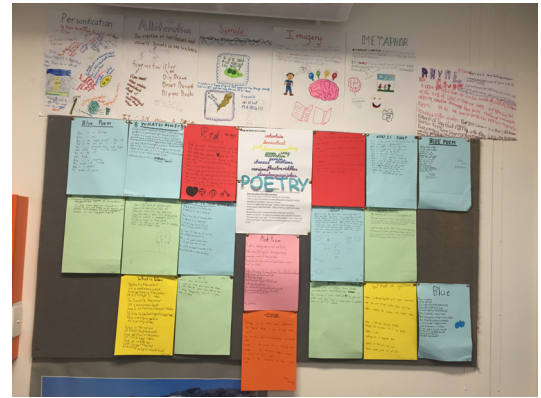
## 3 Opals
