News from the Kindergarten Classrooms

Kindergarten Volleyroos & Kindergarten Jackaroos

Kindergarten Volleyroos and Kindergarten Jackaroos are enjoying taking part in Sports in Schools activities every Tuesday. On odd weeks they will participate in dance and every even week they will complete social skills activities. The social skills activities are designed to help develop students' interaction skills through communication and teamwork.

During literacy sessions, Kindergarten students are learning about persuasive texts in order to write their speeches for the upcoming Public Speaking Competition. They are learning the difference between fact and opinion, and how to structure their speeches. Speeches will be presented in Week 4 during class time. In addition to this, during afternoon Chatterbox time, students are learning how to present an impromptu speech. When students are given a topic, they are required to state something positive, something negative and something interesting. This technique aims to help them develop the skill to talk about a topic spontaneously.

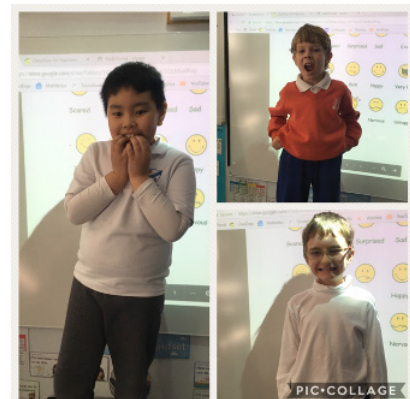
During Weeks 3 and 4, Mathematics lessons are linked to 3-Dimensional Space and Addition and Subtraction. Every Thursday we visit the computer lab to learn how to log on and to complete set Mathematics tasks. Later this term students will learn how to type simple Word documents. Thank you to those who encourage your child to log on at home with your assistance, as this is helping them to become more independent when logging on at school.



K-4 Sapphires

What a great start to Term 3! K-4 Sapphires has been improving their acting skills in drama. They have been demonstrating how to use their face and whole body to show emotions. The students have enjoyed acting out a wide range of emotions with their classmates. The acting is improving each week and sometimes it is so believable we need to ask the student how they are really feeling.

The students have used what they have learnt from drama to help them in Personal Development and Health lesson. They have been learning about different relationships in their lives and how they act and feel with different people. They have shown how much they care for their family and friends however they may show it differently as it is okay to hug and kiss your family. They have acted out how to treat friends at school and how to help if a friend is upset.

Stage 1 Buffalo Creek Excursion

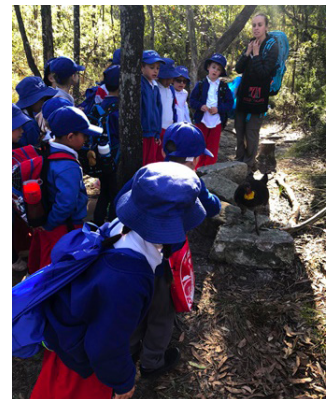

'I liked searching for insects because we could look at spiders using a magnifying glass' - Ethan



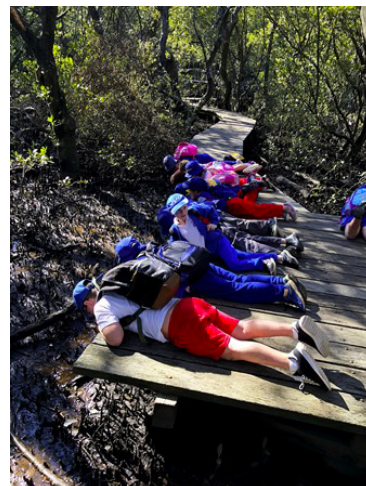
2 Rollers

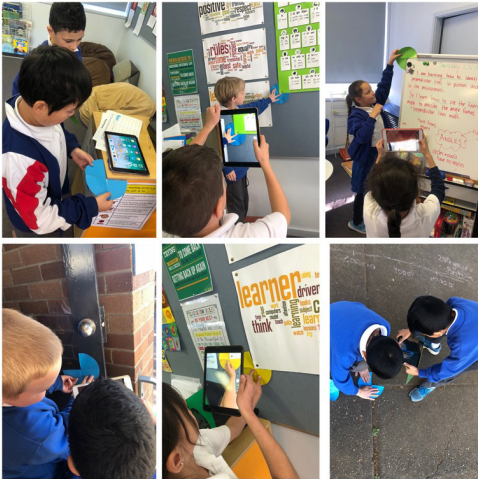

We have been working on products and information during Science, and discussing how we access information to identify the different ways people communicate and use technology. In Mathematics, we have been discussing regular and irregular shapes, perpendicular lines and symmetry. Students created an angle eater to locate the right angles in and around the classroom. They then presented their information as a Popplet on the iPads.

3 Steelers have had a busy start to the term! Sports In Schools has started and we are all enjoying the variety of activities so far. We alternate each week between team building activities and dance. Last week we learnt some new moves to the song 'Up town funk?' So much fun!

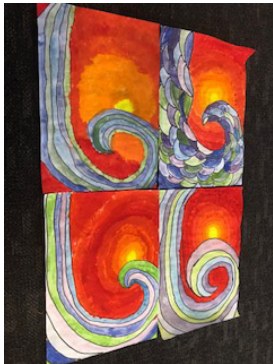

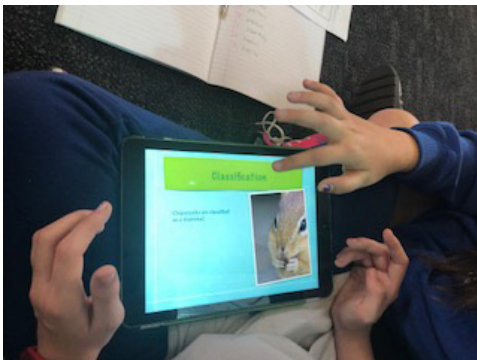
News from the Stage 3 Classrooms

Stage 3 News

Mrs Adams - 5 Kookaburras have had a wonderful start to the term. Our class have been practicing our writing in preparation the Public Speaking Competition. In Visual Arts, our class learnt about warm and cool colours and how to blend paints to create a wave design. In Mathematics, our class has been learning how to measure angles using a protractor and how to identify the multiples of a number. In History, we have started to learn about Federation and the importance of our Australian Government to prepare for our Stage 3 Canberra excursion in Week 7. Our class have enjoyed learning new skills in the computer lab and on the iPads and have recently demonstrated our understanding of how to research information to create a presentation using digital tools, such as KeyNote, Creaza, Powtoon and Prezi. 5 Kookaburras look forward to an exciting term ahead!



Sophia and Androniki - In Weeks 1 and 2, we learnt how to use the program on the Apple iPads called 'keynote'. We worked in pairs to pick an animal to research. We chose to research information about chipmunks because they're rare and interesting. From here, we used the iPads to create and prepare a presentation to display information about an animal. On Keynote, we had the opportunity to use a variety of pictures, fonts and special effects to make our presentation engaging. Keynote is extremely easy to use and we really enjoyed utilising this program in class.



Sameera and Hayley - We have been researching information on various topics to help assist us in writing a persuasive speech on an issue in society. We have visited the computer lab to research and summarise our information ready to prepare and deliver our persuasive speeches.

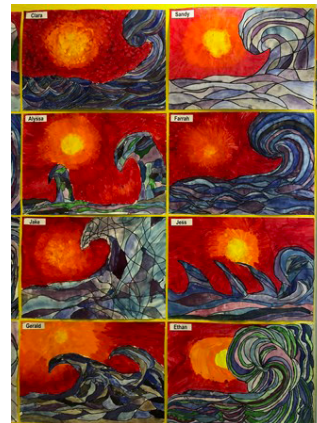


5 Diamonds

Many of us feel a bit nervous about public speaking and this has been a big focus for us this term. Each day we have had a chance to practise preparing an impromptu speech. We have also been researching for our prepared speeches and writing them in class.

In science we have been learning about solids, liquids and gases, and about why particular materials are used for different purposes. In History we have been researching Federation and presenting our research using different digital presentation tools.

Visual Arts is a favourite subject in our class. These are our first finished artworks for the term. We showed the contrast between warm and cool colours and used the blending technique for our sunset.

Tell Them From Me

This term, our school will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the Tell Them From Me survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students, teachers and parents to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used Tell Them From Me to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

It was great to have all the teachers start the term learning how to use sferos, makey makeys and about what happens in Code Club. The teachers developed their skills with problem solving by programming the sfero robot to move through a maze, using everyday items with the makey makeys to create a touch pad for the computer, and how to express themselves with a computer in Code Club.

Every teacher learnt something new and got closer to becoming a Tech Expert. It was great to see everyone having fun and learning. The next step is teaching the students to learn how to use sferos, makey makeys and skills from Code Club to enhance their learning.

At the beginning of this term, the P&C handed over \$23,000 for the purchase of 11 interactive whiteboards so you will see these in all classrooms throughout the school. We have also applied for a \$20,000 Stronger Communities grant from the government

to help fund more synthetic grass – from the Newcombe Ball court to the hall. The total cost of putting in more synthetic grass is \$43,000 so if we are given this grant, it will go a long way to more picnic space for our children but also the communities who use our hall in the afternoons and weekends. We hope to have some positive news about our application in the upcoming months.

We ended Term 2 with a bang! The school disco was a great success with the P&C raising over \$2,000 from the sale of canteen food, tickets and snacks and drinks on the night. Thank you to all the wonderful parents who volunteered on the night both in the hall supervising and in the canteen as well.
