2023 Classes


Shortly we will start to organise classes for 2023, for this we need to determine our exact student numbers. If you are planning on leaving us next year please contact the office ASAP.

Education4ALL Equity program is an initiative by the multi-awards winning EduTech Australia; engages students in a multitude of sustainable and diverse applications, and STEAM activities through collaboration, community partnership, local business partnership, mentoring/ leadership, accountability, and iterative progress.

EduTech Australia sponsored our school with #20 multi awards winning Artec Japanese Robot Programming Education kits including curriculum, we will be using the robotics program until they source out permanent funding for our school.

The program is attached to the Universal Robotics Challenge (URC). The URC is a Japanese series Globally recognised Robotics Challenge exclusive to EduTech Australia and attached to the World final in Japan. The URC is one of three international competitions series; launched and organised by our organisation EduTech Australia to allow international cooperation and measure Australian students STEM skills against their peers from around the world. Additionally, providing teachers with the opportunity to share, expand and enhance their quality teaching & learning in STEM, robotics, programming, and coding education via international opportunities and partnership with STEM experts from around the World. We share the program with Padstow North PS.

The URC is recognised as one of the fastest growing high-profile STEAM & Robotics schools challenge in Australia. In 2021 the URC Australian final attracted Australia's highest profile Government delegates who attended the opening Ceremony in December last year, including Her Excellency The Honourable Margaret Beazley AC QC, Governor of New South Wales, and The Hon. Sarah Mitchell, MLC. NSW Minister for Education and Early Childhood Learning and other governments VIPs.
