We have been enjoying using the online learning platform Sound Waves to introduce and practise hearing sounds in words and completing the activity page in our Sound Waves text books. We sing the chant daily and the activities we can access using this platform are highly engaging and fun for students! Kindergarten are also using familiar nursery rhymes, such as *Humpty Dumpty*, *and Incy Wincy Spider* to practise their speaking and listening during literacy sessions.

During Mathematics, we have been playing a variety of games using dice, cards, dominoes and number lines, which help develop students' early numeracy skills. Students have even learnt how to access games on the iPad by scanning a QR code!

We are all very excited about the new social and emotional learning program called 'You Can Do It'. Students have explored the personalities of their new 'classmates' and have discussed what makes them special. These classmates reflect the 5 key concepts of the YCDI program such as getting along with others, being persistent, showing confidence, being organised and understanding their emotions.

Kindergarten also participate in developmental play, which helps students to get to know their peers and develop their social interaction skills. Students are excited about the Class Dojo points system and are working hard towards earning twenty points, for which they receive a Bronze Award.
